Book Club Guide

Discussion Questions

- 1. Aviva is outgoing and loves to perform while Holly would rather sit in her beanbag chair, reading or writing. Which of the twins do you identify with most? Why?
- 2. Do you have a favorite holiday activity? If so, what is it and why is it your favorite?

We're so much more together, let the celebration start! It's time to let it glow—This is who we are.




